## **Biographical Sketch**

Achyut Chetan earned his PhD for his research on the 'The Missing Mothers of the Indian Constitution and the Gender Politics of its Framing' from Visva-Bharati, the university established by Rabindranath Tagore at Santiniketan, India. He taught English literature at Visva-Bharati for a year before joining Sido Kanhu Murmu University, Dumka as an Assistant Professor of English in 2008. He taught there with a commitment to pedagogy as a means for social transformation in marginal areas, and with a special conviction in constitutional morality for more than a decade before joining St Xavier's University, Kolkata. In the meantime, he had occasions to teach courses at places like the Department of History, Columbia University, New York; University of Texas at Austin; and Department of English at Cornell University, Ithaca. Experiences of teaching at both ends of the spectrum strengthens his conviction in dialogues between different academic spaces and academic disciplines as well as in the emancipatory value of higher education in democratic societies.

Chetan has been a recipient of Sir Ratan Tata Trust Fellowship at School of Women's Studies, Jadavpur University, Kolkata, 2008-09; Charles Wallace Trust India Fellowship, 2018 for his research at the Women's Library, London School of Economics; and a Fulbright Visiting Fellowship at the Department of History at Columbia University, New York, 2011-12. Recently he was the South Asian Studies Fellow at Cornell University, Ithaca, NY for the year 2019-20.

## Areas of Specialisation and Research

Chetan's research interests include the genealogies of constitutional and feminist thought in India on which he has spoken at numerous places including Columbia University, New York; Brooklyn College, New York; City University of New York; University of Texas at Austin,; Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, Presidency University, Kolkata; and Cornell University, Ithaca, NY. He works on the interstices of literary and legal hermeneutics with a specific feminist interest in easing what is known as 'white women's burden' and is interested in creating a better understanding of the politics of the construction of the modern, right-bearing subject in the twentieth century. Chetan's interdisciplinary enquiries are rooted in literary theories of authorship, textuality and discourse analysis, and extend the boundaries of literary studies into diverse fields.

Currently, he is working on his research on 'Situating Indian Feminism in an International Frame: 1930 to 1950', a work that seeks to put our understanding of the relationship between liberalism, ant-colonialism, constitutionalism, and global feminism in a comparative perspective and hopes to re-conceptualize the relationship between Indian and western feminism. His work on the 'Founding Mothers of the Indian Constitution' is forthcoming from Cambridge University Press, Cambridge.
