"Justice is no longer blind": New Lady Justice statue at Bombay High Court reflects evolving judicial values

The recent new unveiling of the Lady Justice statue at the Bombay High Court on October 15, 2023, caused a buzz and engaged all online communities. It represented a more modern, post-traditional concept-its design is not unlike the visions that represent current Indian culture and judicial needs. Traditionally, Lady Justice has been represented blindfolded; this is symbolic to imply that justice is indeed not blind to status, power, or influence. What is remarkable about this statue is that it did not include the blindfold to signify a more open sense of awareness about social context and commitment to openness and transparency. This has implications in the sense that evolving understanding of justice as something more than just being neutral also shows familiarity with social realities. The most radical change is the sword substitution with the Indian Constitution. Traditionally, the sword in Lady Justice has always stood for authority and power of enforcing laws through punishment measures. The new version has instead replaced the sword with a copy of the Constitution that underlines the principles of democracy, human rights, and a protectionary/empowermentover-punishment justice system. Lady addition, tice's attire has been modified according to the Indian ethos. The old one was dressed in judicial clothing from the judiciary evolves to reflect the nation's ideals and changing social needs. Even though the new



colonial era, but the new Lady Justice is dressed in a saree—a cultural icon that has relevance for contemporary Indian society and also reflects the country's steps toward decolonization. Despite these revisions, both statues still retain important symbols: the scales of justice are unchanged, representing balance and equality, symbolizing a commitment to fair decisions and judgments based on evidence and reasonable argument. This new sculpture is a significant step forward in the evolving symbolism of justice in India, reconciling respect for traditional values with a vision for an open and responsive judicial system. As the discussions are ongoing, this new Lady Justice statue at Bombay High Court stands as a stark representation of how India's

The old statue's robe reflected a legacy of colonial-era judicial symbolism. The new one is wearing saree which reflects Indian culture and resonates with contemporary Indian society. Both the statues also has few similarities such as symbolizing balance, fairness, and equality in the judicial process, the focus on impartial decisions based on evidence and arguments from both sides. In conclusion, the move from "old" to "new" Lady Justice in India represents the changing nature of the country's legal system. While the "old" Lady Justice represented traditional values, advocating fairness while remaining somewhat disassociated from modern societal problems, the "new" Lady Justice represents a more responsive, inclusive, and dynamic approach to justice. This shift incorporates technology breakthroughs and social changes, integrating the justice system with modern democratic norms. Thus, Lady Justice in India today serves as a guardian of rights, always adjusting to meet the requirements of a diverse and dynamic community.

India's most respected industrialists and philanthropists, Ratan Tata has passed away at the age of 86. The news of his demise was conveyed to the media houses by the Tata group, one of the largest conglomerates in India which was led by Ratan Tata for two decades. Bomb scares hit Indian airlines, cause panic

In less than 24 hours, 11 flights from various Indian Airlines received bomb threats, triggering a major security scare and heightened concern in the Indian Aviation Sector. On October 18, the London-bound Vistara flight (UK17) from Delhi was diverted to Frankfurt after receiving a threat via social media, while the Jaipur-Dubai Air India Express flight (IX 196) faced a similar threat that later proved to be a hoax, creating considerable disruption. Additionally 5 Akasa Air and 5 IndiGo flights were also the target of these bomb threats on October 19. The threat to the Air India Express flight caused delays for the return Jaipur-Dubai flight the local authorities carried



(IX 195), which departed after a delay of over an hour. Akasa Air stated in a post on X, that following safety and security protocols all passengers had to deplane while

out the necessary procedures, with each plane meticulously checked. They requested passengers' understanding, emphasizing that the ground team did everything possible to minimize the inconvenience. Flights operated by the Indian Airlines have received a shocking 70 such calls in the past 6 days, causing major operational difficulties. These notorious threats are causing significant financial losses which are estimated to be at around 3 crores per false alarm. The Union Civil Aviation Ministry and the BCAS met to discuss ways to tackle the issue. In the investigation, they found that the IP (internet protocol) addresses from which some threats were made were from London, Germany, Canada, and the US. They did not, however, rule out the use of VPN (virtual private networks) by the people who made the threats to hide their actual locations.

On October 14, 2024, Baba Siddique, a prominent Nationalist Congress Party leader and a former Maharashtra cabinet member, was shot in Mumbai. This assassination took place in Bandra, near his son Zeeshan Siddique's office, where Baba Siddique was meeting with some political workers. Later that night, he was sent to Lilavati Hospital but was pronounced dead after several hours. Several Bollywood actors, including Salman Khan and Shahrukh Khan happened to be friends with Baba Siddique previously. Recently, Siddique switched to Ajit Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party faction and aimed to play an active role in the upcoming local elections. Lawrence Bishnoi's gang has also been sensed, which has been engaged in many targeted killings, and is also said to be connected to the murder of Sidhu Moosewala, a Punjabi singer. Police confirm that they had been investigating Bishnoi's background. The assassination might also be related to Salman Khan and the ghetto rehabilitation projects, or possibly even more. During the attack, three men targeted Baba Siddique. Two of the

three attackers were arrested at the crime scene, while the third one escaped. The police mentioned it was clear that it was a planned execution, and assumed that the people who pulled the trigger had already been paid. This case has raised concerns about the protection of powerful figures in Maharashtra, with accusations that the state government is not doing enough to curb the influence of gangs like Bishnoi's.

The Rise And Fall of NFTs: A bubble bound bursting

With the emergence of cryptocurrency and blockchain technology, the concept of digital ownership was a topic of discussion and debate within many circles. NFTs were unique digital tokens that represented the ownership of a specific digital item or content like music, videos or digital art, usually bought through cryptocurrency. volatility and the broader cryptocurrency crash led to a sharp decline in prices. Many buyers, once drawn in to buy by the fear of missing out, faced substantial

losses once the market deflated. One of the main causes could be the oversaturation of the NFT market, with an influx of NFTs engaging in artificial inflation and scarcity. The fact that most NFTs would not retain their value became common knowledge and buyers lost interest, dropping market prices. NFT trading volume dropped nearly 90% from its peak in early 2022 and according to OpenSea, trading volumes fell from a peak of \$405 million in August 2021 to \$5 million in 2023.

Canada's growing strained diplomacy over Khalistan

The Khalistan movement, a decade-long separatist movement seeking to establish an independent Sikh state, has sparked tension between Canada and India.

The conflict of creating an independent Sikh homeland in Punjab, a region split between northern India and Pakistan, gained momentum in the 1980s culminating in the 1985 Air India bombing a violent rhetoric act which killed 329 people, mostly Canadians. Over 468,000, members of the Canadian Sikh community has been accused of supporting Khalistani separatism. In 2022, India accused Canada of harboring Khalistani



separatists, causing diplomatic tension. Canada's Prime Minister Justin Trudeau acknowledged the presence of Khalistani extremists but emphasized Canada's commitment to combating terrorism. The situation took a turn for the worse with the assassination of Hardeep Singh

Nijjar, a prominent separatist leader, in June 2023. Canada's PM alleged that Indian government agents were involved in the murder. Trudeau's government faced criticism from the opposition parties and Indian authorities for allegedly tolerating the Khalistani separatism.

In response, Canada listed Babbar Khalsa and the International Sikh Youth Federation as terrorist entities. While Canada seeks to maintain a good relations with India, it must also address the concerns of its Sikh community, as many Sikh Americans have felt targeted, and have reported experience of harassment and intimidation, with some even facing accusations of being extremists.

The issue remains contentious, with ongoing debates on the Khalistani influence in Canada. As tensions persist, Canada must navigate the delicate balance between combating terrorism and protecting the rights of its diverse citizenry.

Humanitarian crisis unfolds in Gaza amidst escalating conflict

Mohun Bagan claims Derby victory in thrilling encounter

The Kolkata Derby (locally known as "Boro Match" or 'Big Match' in Bengali) is the football match in Kolkata, between arch rivals East Bengal and Mohun Bagan. The rivalry between these two teams is over 100 years old, and the matches witnessed large audience attendance and rivalry between patrons. The Bengali community is divided into two sects that is the "Bangals" and the "Ghotis". The Bangals represent East Bengal and the Ghotis represent Mohun Bagan. It is considered as one of the biggest Asian footballing rivalries. Such is the hype for this match, that the prices of hilsa fish and lobsters increase due to heavy demands. These two water creatures are equally connected with this rivalry between these two sects. The first match was played on 8 August 1921 in Cooch Behar



Cup and latest match of this historical derby was played on 19 October 2024 in Indian Super League.

East Bengal crashed to a 0-2 defeat vs Mohun Bagan in the ongoing Indian Super League (ISL) 2024-25 season's first Kolkata Derby, at the Salt Lake Stadium in Kolkata on Saturday, 19th October. The firsthalf was a cagey affair, but MBSG managed to take a 1-0 lead. In the 41st-minute, Manvir Singh's sizzling low cross found Jaime Maclaren, who converted it with ease. Then in the second-half, Bagan dominated and EBFC failed to find any momentum. Then just before full-time the goalkeeper fouled Petratos, who converted the resulting penalty to make it 2-0. The season's first derby was scheduled to be held on mid August in the Durand cup but was abandoned due to security concerns amid the R.G Kar rape and murder case. Since then East Bengal's for-

tune seems to be not working. EBFC is currently going through a rough patch, where they are still finding a win in the ongoing season. Four consecutive defeats led to the departure of last season's Super Cup-winning coach Carles Cuadrat. Now it is all on their new coach Bruzon to steady the ship and deliver results. East Bengal have found some rhythm now, after qualifying for the quarter finals of AFC Challenge League competition. The Red and Golds are the only club representing India in Asia this season. On the other hand MBSG is comfortably sitting at the second spot of the table winning 4 out of 7 games and having lost only one. They are statistically one of the best teams in ISL at the moment and are on the race for the ISL Shield. The second Kolkata derby is scheduled on 11Th January, 2025 which is expected to be yet another banger of a clash between the two footballing giants.

Revamped UEFA Champions League: A bold step towards innovation

Starting from the 2024-2025 season, the UEFA Champions League will undergo its biggest transformation in over two decades. This new format, often called the "Swiss model," replaces the traditional group stage, expanding the competition from 32 teams to 36. In the revamped structure, each team will now play eight matches in a single league table, rather than the previous system of six matches in a group of four. These eight games will feature four home and four away fixtures, drawn from seeded pots, ensuring a mix of opponents. The league-style table will determine progression to the knockout stages. The top eight teams from this



league phase will automatically qualify for the round of 16. Teams finishing 9th to 24th will enter a two-legged playoff to fill the remaining eight spots. This adds more competitive depth and excitement by providing additional knockout opportunities for teams that narrowly miss the top eight. One of the most significant changes is the calendar. The

competition will stretch over ten European midweeks, giving fans more chances to watch high-quality football throughout the season. This shift increases revenue potential for UEFA and clubs, with broadcasting rights expected to grow. The new format addresses the desire for more marquee matchups and increases fan engagement. However, it

also raises concerns about player fatigue and fixture congestion. As the landscape of European football progresses, all eyes will be on this new structure to see if it delivers its promises of more thrilling and meaningful competition. The format also aligns with UE-FA's goal of raising viewership and revenue, offering an additional 100 matches per season. This innovation comes as part of UEFA's efforts to address the demands of top clubs and retain the Champions League's status as Europe's premier football competition. With more games, a fresh league approach, and a wider representation of clubs, the new format promises an era of high-intensity football and broader opportunities for clubs across Europe.
